### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES ON THE PRIZE WINNERS

MITCHELL SIPORIN was born in New York in 1910 but had his art training in Chicago at the School of the Art Institute from 1927 to 1930 and under Todros Geller during the following two years. Ten years ago he was given a one-man show at the Downtown Gallery in New York and since then has been a frequent exhibitor at leading American annuals. He was the co-winner of the Treasury competition for the St. Louis Post Office murals, largest of the mural contracts.

GALYA PILLIN was born in Chicago in 1926 and is one of the youngest artists to win a prize. She won a four-year scholarship to the School of the Art Institute where she has been working under Louis Ritman, Max Kahn, and Robert Lifvendahl.

LESTER O. SCHWARTZ was born in Manitowoc, Wisconsin, studied at the School of the Art Institute where he won the Ryerson Travel Fellowship in 1937. He spent several months in Bali, then went to Paris. On returning he was given a one-man exhibition at the Art Institute. From a colorful, highly emotional form of expressionism he has now turned to abstract themes. Schwartz is artist in residence at Ripon College, Wisconsin.

AARON BOHROD was born in Chicago in 1907. Among his teachers were John Sloan, Kenneth Hayes Miller, and Boardman Robinson. He was a prominent artist-correspondent during the last war, having visited the fighting fronts both at Guadalcanal and Normandy. This is the eighth prize which Bohrod has won at the Art Institute.

FELIX RUVOLO was born in New York in 1912, spent his childhood in Sicily, then returned to this country. Though he studied for a short time at the School of the Art Institute, he is largely self-taught. From a very gay, romantic style, he has now turned to symbolic themes violently conceived in deep rich tones.

JOAN MITCHELL was born in Chicago in 1925 and began her art studies at the Francis Parker School under Malcolm Hackett. She studied at the Summer School at Saugatuck and is now a student at the School of the Art Institute. In 1944 she was first represented in the Chicago Annual.

FRANK VAVRUSKA was born in Antigo, Wisconsin, in 1917. He went to the University of Wisconsin, then attended the School of the Art Institute where he won the Edward L. Ryerson Foreign Travel Fellowship in 1941. After a year in Mexico he went into the Army. While in an English hospital he began his present style. In 1945 he won a Guggenheim Fellowship.

STANLEY MITRUK was born in Chicago in 1922. He studied at Hull House and at the School of the Art Institute. In 1943 he was commissioned to do costumes and sets for two ballets performed by the Chicago Ballet Repertory Company. He also assisted in the designing and building of exhibitions in the Gallery of Art Interpretation at the Art Institute.

EGON WEINER was born in Vienna in 1906. He graduated from the School for Arts and Crafts in Vienna, then taught art classes until coming to this country in 1938. He has exhibited frequently at the Art Institute, had a one-man exhibition in the Room of Chicago Art, and at present is teaching sculpture in the School of the Art Institute.

SYLVIA SHAW JUDSON, a native of Chicago, studied under Albin Polasek and in Paris under Bourdelle. She has had numerous exhibitions both in New York and Chicago and is especially noted for her sympathetic handling of animals suitable for placing in gardens.

JOHN E. STEWART was born in Port Washington, New York, in 1926 and studied at the School of the Art Institute. He exhibited in the Chicago and Vicinity Annual for the first time last year.

GEORGE BUEHR, born in Chicago in 1905, studied at Antioch College and at the School of the Art Institute. He has long been an exhibitor and was given a one-man show in the Room of Chicago Art. He is Associate Lecturer at the Art Institute.

ELLEN LANYON was born in Chicago in 1926. She studied at the Saugatuck Summer School of Painting and is a student at the School of the Art Institute. Last year she won the Armstrong Prize for the first picture that she exhibited at the Art Institute.

ELEANOR COEN was born in Normal, Illinois, in 1916. She studied at the School of the Art Institute where she won a traveling fellowship which enabled her to spend a year in Mexico. She is an accomplished lithographer as well as a painter.

MIYOKO ITO was born in Berkeley, California, in 1918. She studied at the University of California, Smith College, and the School of the Art Institute. She exhibited for the first time at the Art Institute in 1946.

### HONORABLE MENTION

HERRMANN DYER, born in Wichita, Kansas, in 1916, studied at the University of Chicago and the School of the Art Institute. She has won several prizes.

MAX KAHN, born in Slonim, Russia, in 1904, was brought to this country at the age of three. In 1928-1929 he studied in Paris under Bourdelle, Despiau, and Friesz. He is a notable lithographer as well as a painter.

FREEMAN SCHOOLCRAFT was born in Kalamazoo, Michigan, in 1905. He received his training under Lorado Taft and Albin Polasek. He is an instructor at the University of Chicago.

RUTH WAHLBERG was born in Oak Park in 1924, attended the University of Illinois from 1942-1946, and studied at the State University of Iowa under James Lechay and Mauricio Lasansky.

EMERSON WOELFFER was born in Chicago in 1914. He studied at the School of the Art Institute and is an instructor at the Institute of Design.
