Creates an HTML document

<head></head>

Sets off the title and other information that isn't displayed on the Web page itself

<body></body>

Sets off the visible portion of the document

<h1></h1>

Creates the largest headline

<h6></h6>

Creates the smallest headline

<p></p>

Creates a paragraph

Creates a single carriage return (line skip)

SAMPLE COMMENT (note to yourself, not read by browser scanning HTML formatting)

Creates a hyperlink, absolute or relative
